Who is this course for?

What do you need to apply for the course?

You will also need a Level 2 in English and maths.

What are the key things you'll learn?

You will study 6 units over 1 year.

You will also study a range of specialist optional units including:

- Ethics Human

- Resource Development
- Managing operation

How will you learn?

On this course you will experience a combination of teaching and learning styles as follows:

- Practical and theoretical classroom teaching
- Library drop-in sessions
- Directed work with other students
- Directed private study

Assessments will incorporate workplace knowledge. You may have reports, portfolios, case studies to complete. Each unit is assessed individually and via different means.

Where could this course take you?

After the completion of this course you can progress to employment, a range of study options in Higher Education such as a BA top up programme. Employment opportunities available include: management, administration, personnel, marketing, accounting, and law.

What costs will you incur?
